Friends of Chesterfield County Public Library Accomplishments 2022-2023

Friends Accomplishments

- Major fund raising projects: August 2023 Golf Tournament; Giving Tuesday campaign November 2022.
- Ongoing fundraising through book sales: daily book sales at each library using A-frame units; general book sales; and specialty book sales. We also sell books online through a relationship with Amazon.
- Funded the CCPL Staff Recognition Dinner, May 19, 2023.
- Provided staff appreciation refreshments and activities several times per year, at each library.
- Provided a reception for Friends members at author program June 2023 featuring Rabia Chaudry at Perkinson Center and also volunteer assistance for the event.
- Continue to educate ourselves on library trends through events such as United for Libraries Conference.
- Provided information to the community about the November 2022 bond referendum, which was approved for major library projects. We look forward to what is ahead!
- Through frequent communication with library administration, we support and promote library resources, projects, and staff.

Branch Accomplishments: Highlights of how the Branch Groups supported the library during the year.

- The **Bon Air Friends** contributed \$900 to the wish list for the Bon Air Library to support a new community initiative fostering the love of books. They hosted the "Music Lovers/Antique book sale" in February, making close to \$1,000. They contributed \$6,000 for the Program Fund and \$1,000 for LEAP (Librarian Education Assistance Program), helped staff celebrate National Library Week and the end of Summer Reading.
- The **Central Friends** contributed to the annual Program Fund, National Library Week and staff appreciation. Members volunteered for many events: Perkinson Arts book & author, first Golf Tournament, 50th Annual Meeting, and held a successful April book sale. On a weekly basis, volunteers box and sort books for all Friends groups for their A-Frames. They also contributed \$200 to the annual meeting.
- The **Friends of Chester Library** donated \$2,000 to the Program Fund, had a big book sale at Chesterfest in September 2023 and sponsored the Library of Virginia bus to be onsite during Chesterfest.
- The **Clover Hill Friends** have made donations to the Collection, various Library Programs, a staff wish list, and supported the Clover Hill Aquarium.
- The **Ettrick-Matoaca Friends** collaborated to spearhead two golf tournament fundraisers. The proceeds from the first golf tournament were used to facilitate "Spaced Out at the Library" programs and materials at the Ettrick-Matoaca and Meadowdale locations. They also supported the Holiday Festival in November 2022 with lunch for the library and and Friends teams staffing the event.
- The **Enon Friends** look forward to opportunities to serve the library and community in the coming year!
- The LaPrade Friends held several staff appreciation events and contributed to the Program Fund and LEAP.
 They held a successful special book sale of leather-bound classics and autographed books in December
 2022. They are planning a 2023 Christmas staff appreciation and a Panera boxed lunch for staff packing the
 library after shutdown for renovation, and will be inactive while the library undergoes renovation.
- The **Meadowdale Friends** provided refreshments for the Meadowbrook High School art show, provided lunch for the ESL Family Literacy Program, updated the Book Sale A-frame monthly, worked at the trailer twice a month with Central Friends, provided refreshments at National Night Out, purchased a Ficus tree for the library, hosted a DVD sale at the Galaxy Day event, and attended a garden patio dedication.
- The **Midlothian Friends** are delighted to have begun contributing, financially, to the new Midlothian Library. We are sponsoring a mural in the entrance with a gift of \$5000 and will be helping to provide the refreshments for the Grand Opening. We will also be gifting nearly \$10,000 for beautification of the exterior. We hope to have a specialty sale of autographed books shortly after the opening.
- The North Courthouse Road Friends provided \$5,000 to the Program Fund; provided \$1,000 to the LEAP fund; provided funding for the staff to enjoy an evening of bonding; and held a History Book Sale on Sept. 14-16, 2023. The NCR Friends provide snacks for the library staff on election days and meet quarterly.
